At the June 7, 2006 meeting of Eight Streets Neighborhood Association, owners and management of the Butcher Shop and B& G Oysters, Ms. Susanne Nasuti, Mr. Justin Morreau, and Ms. Barbara Lynch, asked for the support of the Membership in their request to add a cordial license to their existing beer/wine licenses attached to the spaces at 550 Tremont St. (B&G Oysters) and 552 Tremont St. (Butcher Shop).

While they could not clearly define what a cordial license included, they were clear in their request that they only wanted to offer 4 or 5 different cordials to be served at the end of the meal or as an aperitif. These would include items such as Pernod, Sambuca, Fernet Branca, and Campari. They agreed that they had no plans or intentions to expand this to include any other items, such as flavored vodkas, or to serve cocktails. The Eight Streets membership agreed to not oppose Butcher Shop and B&G Oysters getting a cordial license under these conditions.
